

"To build and not destroy"---Bach

In reply to the letter in the <u>Carbon</u> of April 9, 1962 signed "Y.C.S."

It is necessary to point out that the following is not the official opinion of the <u>Phoenix</u> or of the <u>Phoenix</u> editor, but is merely the opinion of one staff member.

Why doesn't the <u>Phoenix</u> take a stand on important school problems? In order to answer this, one must look into the entire Catholic school system. There seems to be some undefinable concept in nearly every Catholic school which determines what can or what cannot be said in school publications. The results are evident in our editorials.

Instead of writing editorials which constructively criticize negative elements in the school, the paper turns out those of a "pseudo-religious" nature which even the paper's staff does not read. Instead of writing editorials which offer suggestions toward improving Marian, the paper turns out editorials discussing the feasibility of having the Mass in the vernacular. This is an interesting subject, but it is hardly going to have any effect on realizing Marian's potential. The blame here rests on the staff of whom I am one. In the past we have been too wishy-washy about speaking up on school problems.

But the concept extends further. Once again it strikes, this time forcing the faculty moderator of the paper to write an editorial on decent literature, which, in reality, apologizes to a pressure group outside the school for the paper's having printed what this pressure group considers to be "aiding" indecent literature. And it is the faculty moderator who refuses to let a letter from another faculty member be printed in which this faculty member criticizes the Phoenix for having apologized to this pressure group. In both cases it is the faculty moderator who has determined the editorial policy, not the editorial staff.

The guilt falls on both the staff and the faculty moderator. It is the staff who has taken an indifferent attitude toward realizing its responsibilities of editorial judgment. It is the faculty moderator who, in a few instances, has extended the limits of her authority and stops moderating and begins to rule. The school paper exists for the benefit of the students. It should serve to bring about an understanding between faculty and student, thereby creating a harmonious atmosphere within the college. This the Phoenix has failed to do. It has not been pro-student, anti-student, pro-faculty or anti-faculty. It has been lukewarm.
