

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN IN THE Y. C. S .:

We noted with interest the complaints brought forth by the Y. C. S. However, we feel that the investigators were exercising rash judgment in some of the conclusions drawn.

Let it be said, first of all, that a newspaper has a greater purpose than solely to create controversy. The Associated Collegiate Press Newspaper manual states that the function of a college paper is to "provide an organ of information that will present all the news...; to provide an organ for the expression of student thought and to unify ideals and objectives; to create a wholesome college spirit and to support the institution's best traditions." It further states that "no paper should be on an eternal crusade." It is our belief that information, entertainment, and influence should be on an even keel. Controversy is not an end in itself, although it appears that some would desire it so.

Secondly, we have discussed topics of interest to those on campus, i. e. Mike Noone and athletic assists (Nov. issue) and the use of the vernacular in the Liturgy (Jan. issue). The world is wider than the sphere which we call the Marian college campus. If the inquisitors had only taken sufficient time to investigate, they would have seen that the Phoenix won an honorable mention for, believe it or not, expressing an opinion. No one can deny that the Liberal-Conservative issue is not a heated issue on campus as well as the national scene. We simply ex-

pressed our personal opinion.

We would be interested in knowing how many years of Phoenix publications were observed in drawing conclusions about the dearth of letters to the editor. We personally have asked many students to write letters, yet suddenly they clam up at the thought. WE consider ourselves fortunate in having received three letters to the editor (the latest will be in the April issue). It must set some sort of a record. On closer examination, one letter emanated from a faculty member, one from a graduate, AND ONLY ONE FROM A STUDENT. Wherein does the apathy lie? Or are students afraid to let others know they are doing some critical thinking? Letters DO NOT have to be an answer to something that appeared in print.

With regard to criticism, just what kind of criticism does the Y. C. S. advocate? It doesn't take a thimbleful of brains to be a complainer or fault-finder, but it does take a great amount of wisdom and fortitude to come forth with something constructive. Abraham Lincoln, who was skilled in handling hecklers and rabble-rousers, said, "My good friend here reminds me of a steamboat that used to run down the river when I was a lad.
