EDITORIAL

Alcohol Policy

Last Sunday at the Student Board Meeting, a special committee was formed to draw up a new Alcoholic Beverage Policy. This type of policy is not new to Student Board, for they had one presented to Faculty Council last year only to be defeated. A lot has been learned by the Board concerning such a policy and I feel that the decision to draw up a new policy is a good one. Certain state restrictions regarding alcohol on a college campus are currently being investigated and the formal policy should be submitted to faculty council by December.

I believe it is imperative that the student body, as a whole, back this policy once it is formulated. Last year, one of the major reasons why the policy failed was the lack of student support. This is not to say that students did not agree with the policy, but the general lack of vocal support on the part of students impaired the policy greatly. I genuinely feel that students were afraid to speak out on this proposal for fear of some factions of the college community looking down on them.

Much has been said concerning alcohol on campus from faculty and administration. Much of it is well taken, but on the other hand, many of the comments illustrate a general mistrust of students to make responsible and mature decisions concerning alcohol. Most students know the implications concerning the use of alcohol. This is not to say that any descision made by a student (or anyone for that matter) concerning alcohol will be a good one, for wrong decisions are made by everyone, even 21 yr. olds. One must keep in mind that there is a definite distinction between irresponsible and responsible drinking. FROM THE MASSES:

Dear Carbon,

On Sunday last, Sept. 30, 1973, Student Board unanimously approved a proposal of great importance and potential value to the Marian student. This was the Proposal for a Student Representative to the Board of Trustees. ' proposal is an excellent one I feel, but I take issue with Board's proposed selection of this representative. The following passage is taken directly form the proposal as it was voted on by Student Boards

"The Student Representative to the Board of Trustees will be elected by the Executive Board of the Marian College Student Association fact that one of the goals of the college is in May, in order to serve for the following academic year. Only the officers of the Executive Board of the Marian College Studert Association can be nominated for this position."

Specifically, I take issue with the Board limiting the candidate for representative to Executive Board members, and the voting to the Student Board members. A position of such potential importance to the Student Body should be elected in a general election, and the Representative should not be limited to an Executive Board member, but to any one who would meet the requirements to be elected to Student Board.

President of the Bornd, Mary Grace Platt, and the other members who unanimously agreed with her, based her rationale on this item that the Marian Student is not informed, qualified, intelligent, interested, etc., enough to be trustea with the task of selecting this important person. She stressed only a Board member has compentent enough to select this person,


To a great extent she is right. The mere fect that this proposal passed 11-0 in favor of, without ever being presented to the Student Body in a Referendum is evident of the Marian Student apathy.

I for one, feel qualified enough to select a competent Student Representative, and I can think of a number of qualified students to hold the position in question besides the Executive Board officers.

The Board claims that the students will be, indirectly, voting through their elected Board members. This is not true. Would Mary Grace like to see the President of the U.S. elected via the House of Representatives??

I hope the Marian Student will take the initiative to protest this part of the proposal by contacting a Board member and "xpressing your displeasure, or petitioning, anything at least. Show Mary Grace & her elitist Board that the Marian Student does have an interest in It is important that the Student Government. Board be answersel to the students who elect them, and not above them.
