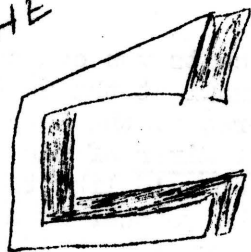

CAMPUS QUEEN ELECTIONS THIS WEEK

Every year the campus votes for a senior girl who, in the opinion of the students, represents the spirit and ideals of Marian College. At a coronation ceremony followed by a musical the campus queen is formally acknowledged as queen. It is her privilege to express a message of farewell from the seniors to the college. Every senior girl is eligible for this honor. There are no nominating groups, only a direct vote from the students chooses the queen. Every student except the senior girls is eligible to vote for the senior that seems to represent best the spirit of Marian. The election for this year's queen will be held this Friday from 8:30 to 12:30 in the Reading Room. The Campus Crowning will be held on Sunday, May 26.

The election is run on a point system as follows: You will be allowed to vote for five girls. The girl you wish to be chosen queen should be designated by the number 5, the second choice 4 and so on. The girl receiving the highest number of points will be queen and the four runners-up will be in the court. Do not, repeat, do not, designate your first choice by the number 1. This will lessen the number of points your candidate will receive and will defeat your purpose.

To some this may not appear to be an important election because the student will not be in any way affecting the student government of the school, but the choice will be indicative of the students' feelings about Marian. You have your choice of 24 girls for this honor, the one who is queen should represent you.
